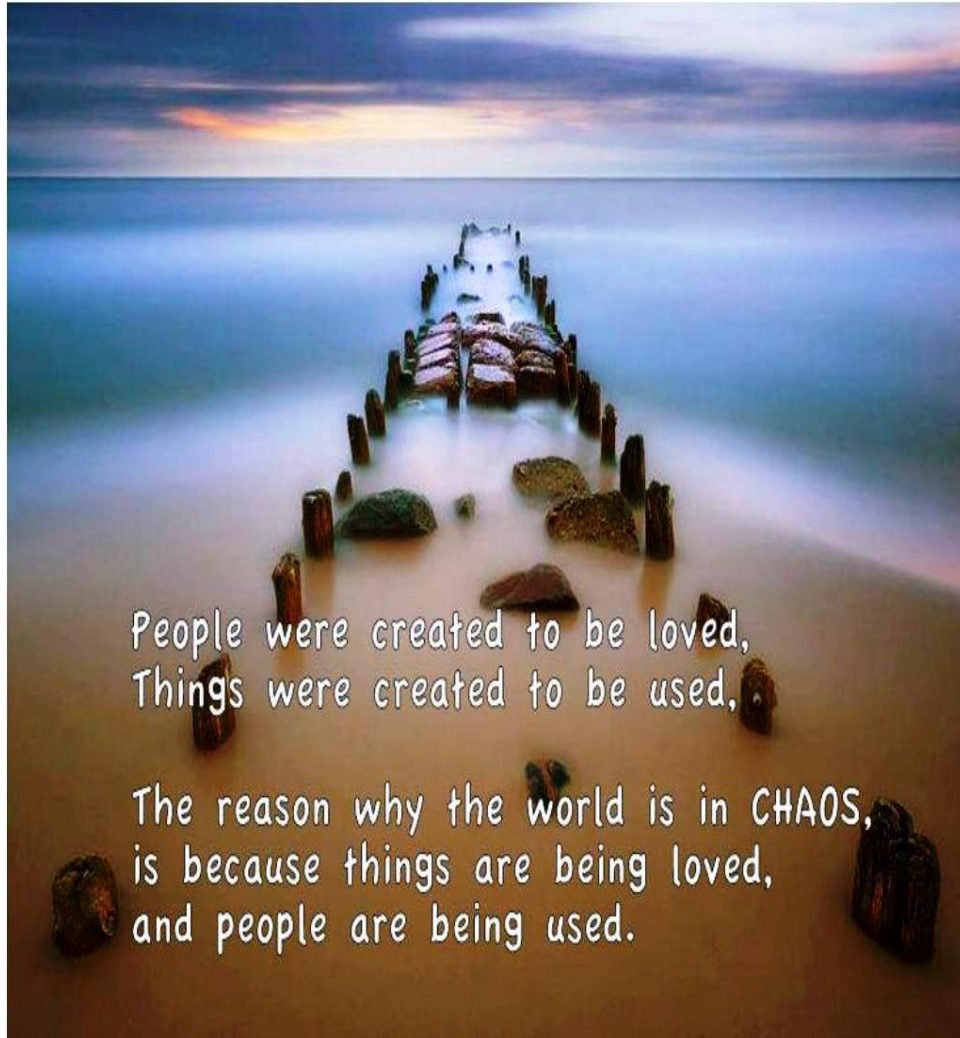

As a psychologist and a licensed clinical social worker, “Dr. Jamie” has built his innovative 30-year career on the premise that “Necessity is the Mother of Invention.” He believes that the resilience of the human spirit and effective collaboration are keys to the future of our country’s healthcare.

Taking the shame and stigma out of mental health and underlying trauma has been Dr. Jamie’s lifelong mission. He has done this through television, creating national charities and now through Primary Care as Chief Compassion Officer at WellMed. He is a fierce advocate for integrated, patient-centered medicine and a workforce in touch with its own wellness.

His understanding of medical models around healthcare and the clinical delivery of services focused on psychiatry, addictions, underlying trauma, dialectical behavioral approaches, and family systems has been the touchstone of all his work in for profit and nonprofit leadership roles throughout his career.

Professional Experience

2010–Present – WellMed Medical Management, Inc.

Currently serving as the Clinical Program Developer of the WellMed Emotional Support Response Team (ESRT), his current title is Chief Compassion Officer. Dr Huysman provides and facilitates the variety of services developed specifically for Complex Post Traumatic Stress and Post Traumatic Stress which was exacerbated by the Covid-19 Pandemic.

He is scaling this CPTSD/Resiliency Initiative nationally, overseeing all interventions, prevention programming, and the training of High Performing Teams for this UnitedHealth company. Treatment plans for clinical settings have been created in tandem with psychoeducational programming for patients, enterprise personnel, physicians, and family caregivers with vicarious traumatization and secondary traumatic stress reactions. He clinically consults to corporate Licensed Clinical Social Workers, working with over 350 clinics and case managing the medical and behavioral needs for over 200k patients in Florida and over 400,000k patients altogether.

Initially, as VP of Provider Relations and Government Affairs, Huysman was responsible for clinical programming and integration of behavioral health services into existing medical model. He coordinates with government and quasi-government agencies in Florida, Texas, and Washington, DC. He currently is on the Board of Trustees for the Florida Council on Aging. Additionally, he is an international presenter on addictions, trauma, and other behavioral health challenges.



Professional Experience

2002-2010 - Executive Director/Co-Founder of The Leeza Gibbons Memory Foundation

Dr. Huysman created the concept and programming for a new national charity, serving the behavioral and medical needs of family caregivers of those impacted by memory disorders and other chronic conditions. Supervised all direct clinical services and operations nationwide. The first **Leeza's Place** opened in NYC in 2003. Subsequently, he negotiated funding partners for additional locations from 2004 – 2008. Over the course of his tenure as Executive Director, 10 communities had support services, programs, and events for family caregivers and their loved ones. While at the LGMF, he co-wrote a National Bestseller called *Take Your Oxygen First* with Leeza Gibbons and Dr Rosemary Laird, centered around the burnout and compassion fatigue of family caregivers. He and 10 other national caregiver thought leaders wrote the clinical standards for the NASW/Hartford Foundation/AARP Caregivers of Older Adults

2010- Present- Clinical Services of James Huysman, PsyD, LCSW, CFT

Dr. Huysman continues to be available for interventions at residential treatment centers while seeing patients who are looking to recover from narcissistic abuse through CPTSD healing practices. His clinical offices in Plantation Florida treat individuals, groups, and concierge services for spouses and partners who are in relationships with Cluster B personality partners. He also works with patients on no-contact plans and with those who have modified contact because of co or parallel parenting situations in high conflict relationships and divorces. Parental alienation is an additional special track for his involvement with his patients.

1994-2010 – Centers for Psychological Growth

Assessed, evaluated, and treated behaviorally challenged adolescents, couples, and seniors. His special concentration was working with the PTSD and CPTSD challenges of First Responders. Dr. Huysman conducted national retreats for clients and professionals, lecturing nationally and provided continuing education credit and continuing medical education in seminars for social workers, psychologists and physicians

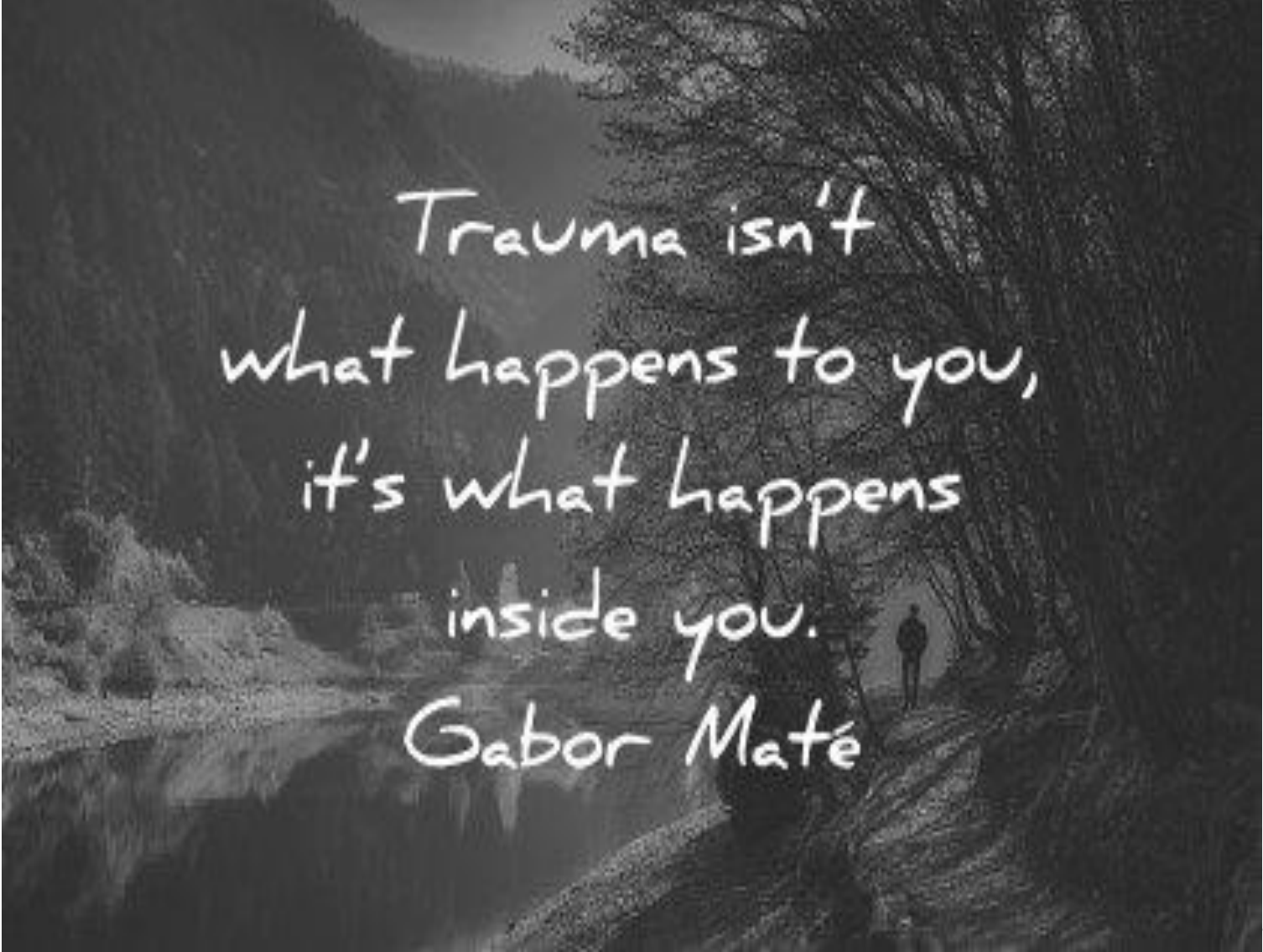
